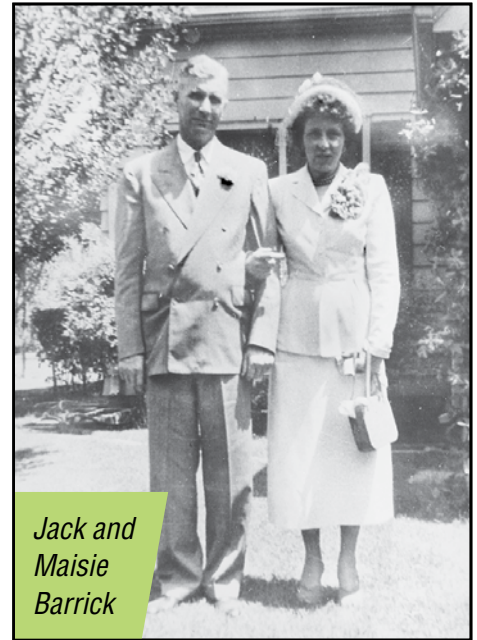

From there, we started working with John Griffin who helped promote the Foundation and other nonprofits as he consulted individuals with their estate planning. Griffin

introduced the Foundation to the Anritter sisters as well as Maisie Barrick and John and Elizabeth Rislov... in addition to other donors who remain anonymous. Our involvement with Griffin got me more interested in charitable planning as a trust officer working at Norwest Bank (now Wells Fargo).

Working with attorneys Alan Austin, Tom Green and Irv Hinderaker in the early years was also instrumental.

I'm proud to have had a hand in several of the large bequests to the Foundation. Now, it's exciting to see us move into a more open setting, trying to bring in outlying community donors as well as land owners.

\$500,000 to the Boys & Girls Club in 2016. We have reached approximately \$15 million in assets and have awarded about \$6 million in grants since the Foundation was started in 1979.

Annual Grants

On a mission to invest in the vitality of Watertown, the Watertown Area Community Foundation awarded a total of \$452,511 in 2015 through grants and scholarships. The grants went to many deserving organizations and programs. The breakdown is as follows: \$24,800 went to the arts; \$286,202 to health and human services; \$75,880 to education and \$65,629 to environment.

Education

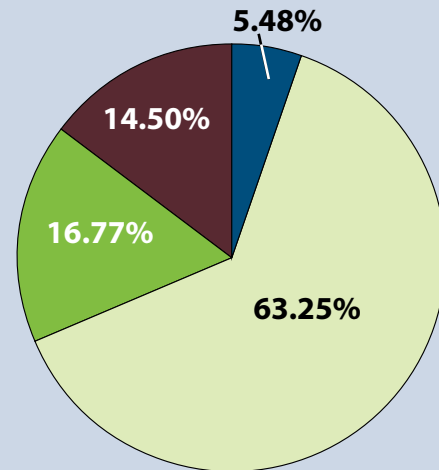

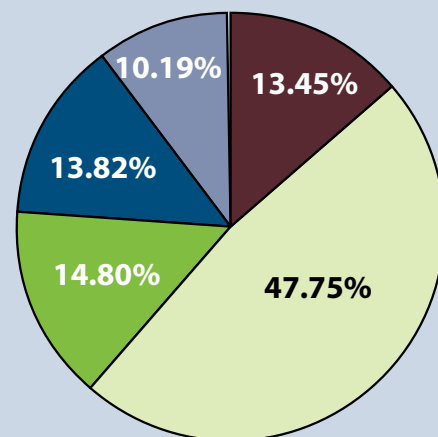

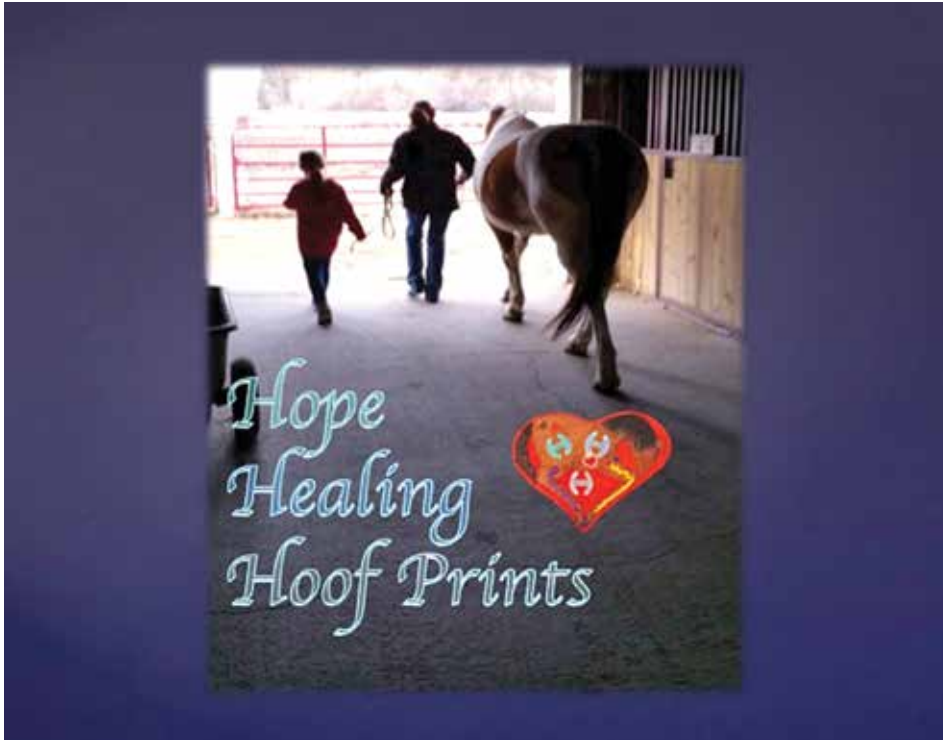

Hope, Healing & Hoof Prints



On a mission to help sexually abused children, Tony and Jo Vitek established a fund at the Watertown Area Community Foundation with that focus. Chief Jo's HHH (Hope, Healing & Hoof Prints) Fund introduces abused children to a new friend – that of a horse at Joy Ranch. HHH has already assisted several children through an equine experience, but the mission continues to grow serving Watertown and a 13-county area in northeast South Dakota. With the word spreading about Chief Jo's HHH Fund, many adult survivors of child sexual abuse have come forward and they, too, will be helping with the HHH program. Many of the adult survivors met each other for the first time in April during Sexual Assault Awareness Month at Lake Area Tech's sponsored Hope and Healing Service held at First United Methodist Church. Since that time, they have networked and met at

Joy Ranch to get a bird's eye view of Chief Jo's HHH program for children. The group of adult survivors consists of mostly women and they have expressed a desire to help the children because they too know first hand the pain associated with childhood sexual abuse. "I am so very thankful to know these ladies," said, Jo. "Their willingness to step forward and help make a difference is nothing short of amazing!"

Currently, the group is contemplating spending more time together. "All of us are at various locations on our journeys and one thing is certain, together we can build friendships and support each other along the way." Nancy Adair is conferring with Equine Specialist Carmen Werning and plans to lead regular meetings where adult survivors can provide grooming to the HHH horses at Joy Ranch and Kara Julius has stepped up to spearhead a weekend winter retreat for adult survivors of sexual abuse scheduled for Feb. 24-26, 2017. Chief Jo says they are discussing a variety of possibilities that weekend to include yoga, painting, clay modeling, sleigh rides, fireside chats and sing alongs, prayer and worship services. HHH support has been great, Jo said, noting that many pastors from different churches are involved in addition to the sisters from Mother of God Monastery, counselors from Beacon Center and LATI, as well as law enforcement, Joy Ranch, the Foundation and the Watertown School District. We are extremely grateful to the community for their willingness to tackle the problem of child sexual abuse head-on.
